Percent of Projected Growth Met is the ratio of observed (actual) growth to projected growth (after fall screening) for the group.


In this instance, a new curriculum should result in a percentage ≥100%, and this number should be higher than the baseline year. 100% is typical growth.

What is the Percent of Projected Growth Met?

The percent of projected growth met is an ideal metric for evaluating a new curriculum because it accounts for individual student starting points.

A successful curriculum should help all students, from those scoring high to those scoring low, exceed their expected growth. The score above 100% confirms that the *sum of all gains* exceeded the *sum of all goals*.


Why is the Percent of Projected Growth Met important?



Aggregate Percent of Projected Growth Met from 2022-2025








