Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Amanda Moore Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-2024 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-2022. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-2022. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

#### Key Challenges

Amanda Moore Elementary School will continue to focus on closing the achievement gap for our economically disadvantaged subgroup. We will close this gap by continuing to analyze our testing data to determine which students need additional academic support. Once those students are identified, they will receive supplemental support through our district's newly adopted Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) procedures and Title I interventioni. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff, and the community in this effort.

# **Process for Assigning Pupils to the School**

Students are assigned to Amanda Moore Elementary School based on predetermined district boundaries. These boundaries divide students between five elementary schools. Additionally, students come to Amanda Moore Elementary School via school of choice.

## The Status of the 3-5 Year School Improvement Plan

Amanda Moore Elementary School's current School Improvement Plan (SIP) will continue to be revised this school year. Our decision to continue to revise our plan was based on careful analysis of the impact of significant curriculum changes which rendered many of our strategies not applicable. In addition, student achievement data from MI-Access, M-Step, and other important benchmark assessments were carefully analyzed and helped support the decision for further revision of our plan. This is a living document and is revised each year based on new data. Our current plan includes five goals for the areas of mathematics, science, reading, writing, and social studies. We are focusing our plan on Social and Emotional Learning. We are continuing to focus on improving proficiency scores in all subject areas on state standardized assessments.

## Local Student Achievement Results

Beginning in the 2018-2019 school year, our school started using the NWEA MAP Growth Assessment as a local measure of student performance. In spring of 2023, our students' aggregate performance was at the 57th percentile in NWEA MAP Growth Reading and at the 61st percentile in NWEA MAP Growth Math.

# The Percentage of Students Represented at Parent-Teacher Conferences

Parent representation is crucial to a student's educational success. During the 2021-2022 school year, over 96% of parents/guardians attended conferences. During the 2022-2023 school year, over 97% of parents/guardians attended conferences.
