#### STUDENT and PARENT CONTRACT

Welcome to Romeo Virtual Academy! The intent of this letter is to share all steps of the process of joining RVA and lay out the expectations and requirements of being a virtual student and supporting parent. Taking an online class is a lot of responsibility for students. Self-discipline and organizational skills are necessities for success in virtual school. Online courses often require more reading and writing than traditional courses. Your course provider offers "Student Orientation" modules to help you become acclimated to the learning management system as well as tips and tricks for completing assignments and staying on track with your pacing guide. If this is your first experience with these course providers, completion of this module is required before you can continue with your other courses. RVA middle school students in grades 6-8 are enrolled in 7 courses as required by Michigan State Standards. RVA high school students will take 6 classes that satisfy all Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements as well as elective options.

#### Joining RVA

Here are the steps for joining RVA

- 1. Schedule meeting with RVA Supervisor
  - a. Review transcripts—email your most recent transcript to <a href="mailto:amy.maruca@romeok12.org">amy.maruca@romeok12.org</a> She will determine which classes are needed to work toward graduation.
  - b. <u>Establish student schedule</u>—The schedule will be developed to meet the criteria of the Michigan Merit Curriculum, while also allowing students to choose available electives when applicable.
- 2. RVA Mentor will meet with student to develop an individualized learning plan.
  - a. <u>Develop pacing guide</u>—The mentor will work with the student to create a pacing guide that best fits the needs of each student, while also ensuring completion of all courses within the semester. The pacing guide will lay out which classes to work on and what percentage of the course needs to be completed each week. Students must keep pace with the pacing guide to remain in the RVA program.
  - b. <u>Schedule weekly mentor meetings</u>—Together, the mentor and student will schedule a recurring weekly meeting that can be in-person or virtual (via Google Meet). These will be quick, 10 minute meetings to review the student's progress, grades, and to ensure the student is staying current with the pacing guide. Parents are encouraged to join the weekly student/mentor meetings.
- 3. Attend RVA Orientation (In Person or Remotely)
  - a. <u>Technology distribution</u>—Each RVA student will receive a Chromebook for use in their online classes if one has not already been provided by the district.
  - b. <u>Learning management system overview</u>—A tutorial of how to use the online course provider's website including accessing resources, submitting assignments, and checking grades and progress.
  - c. <u>Review student expectations</u>—Since virtual learning lacks the structure of in-person learning, it is imperative that students maintain a schedule, regular attendance/engagement, and a pace to ensure they are able to complete all courses by the end of the semester.

The following are required for students to remain a Romeo Virtual Academy student:

- Attend weekly scheduled meetings with mentor (in person or remotely) to discuss grades, pace and progress.
- Maintain a minimum pace, with passing grades, as is specified by each student's individualized pacing guide.
   This pacing guide will outline the amount of progress that needs to be made in each course, each week.
- Meet all requirements for Count Day each semester. Mentors can provide specifics on Count Day requirements.
- Report to assigned building to take all standardized tests, and give full effort on those assessments.

#### Resources

<u>Weekly Mentor Meetings</u>—As is described above, students are required to meet with their mentor weekly; either in person or remotely. This meeting is mandatory as it is imperative that students stay on pace to be successful in an online learning environment.

<u>Learning Lab</u>—In the Learning Lab, students can meet with their mentor, have a quiet place to work, and receive academic support. The Learning Lab hours for the 2025-26 school year will be daily during the normal high school/9GA school hours. The RVA Lab is housed in the 9th Grade Academy building (formerly Powell Middle School). The address is 62100 Jewell Rd, Washington. Use the north entrance of the building where the bus drop off loop is and enter at door #11. There is an RVA sign on the outside wall of the building to indicate the RVA entrance. The lab is the first room on the right as you enter the building.

<u>Tutoring</u>—In addition to the Learning Lab, RVA students are also able to attend any tutoring offered by Romeo High School.

### **Other Important Information**

<u>Communication</u>—In addition to the weekly mentor meetings, it is important for students (and parents) to be in regular communication with their mentor. Students and parents will need to provide various forms of communication including phone numbers (including student cell phone numbers) and email addresses. Both students and parents need to regularly check email and respond quickly, since we rely on email as a main source of communication in the RVA program.

<u>Extra Curricular Activities</u>—RVA students are welcome and encouraged to participate in any extracurricular activity provided by Romeo High School. This includes, but is not limited to, athletics, clubs, sports, and dances. Academic and attendance expectations for athletics are relevant for all students, including RVA students.

<u>State Standardized Testing Policy</u>–In order to be promoted or meet graduation requirements for a diploma, all Romeo Community Schools' students at the elementary, middle and high school levels are required to take all M-Step, PSAT, SAT, and WorkKeys assessments, and any other State or Federal assessments and are expected to put forth their best effort.

<u>Class Ranking</u>—Students who graduate from RVA are not ranked with the other members of their class who attend school in person and are not eligible for the top ten or valedictorian or salutatorian titles. Students are eligible for other academic honors including but not limited to, honor roll, National Honor Society, and scholarships.
