HEALTH SERVICES PATHWAY EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Health services focus on improving the lives of individuals and their community through health education, medicine and the social sciences. The emergency medical pathway explores the field emergency medicine. This unique pathway offers students, specifically those interested in emergency medicine, a jumpstart on a rewarding career in one of the fastest growing industries. The senior year Emergency Medical Technician class offers clinical rotations and pre-hospital agencies in our area. The ultimate goal is successful completion of the pathway and becoming a licensed Emergency Medical Technician.

If a student chooses this pathway, each academic year (10, 11, 12) they will be required to take core classes (Math, English, Science and Social Studies) in addition to one required pathway class.
