



## HEALTH SERVICES PATHWAY NON-EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Health services focus on improving the lives of individuals and their community through health education, medicine and the social sciences. The non-emergency medical pathway explores knowledge and skills used in careers such as nursing, medical assisting, and advanced medicine and specialties. Performing diagnostic testing, evaluating 21st century health concerns, and understanding how the human body interacts with internal and external factors are critical to ensuring community health and wellness within this pathway. If a student chooses this pathway, each academic year (10, 11, 12) they will be required to take core classes (Math, English, Science and Social Studies) in addition to one required pathway class.
