

# **Early Entrance**

At the Early College of Macomb (ECM), 11<sup>th</sup> grade students enter a college program while still in high school.

They benefit from a curriculum that enables them to earn their high school diploma and attend a 13<sup>th</sup> year of school after graduation, earning an Associate's Degree with no cost to themselves for tuition, fees and books.

# **Early Exit**

Students in the ECM may complete the program with an Associate's Degree in three years (grades 11, 12 and 13).

Early College of Macomb students attend high school classes in their home schools, as well as career-focused classes on the Macomb Community College campus. Students engage in an exciting curriculum taught by both high school and college instructors that will move them *ahead of a traditional schedule* toward degrees or technical certificates that match the students' chosen career pathways.

# **Early Success**

Once students complete the program, they are poised for immediate success.

They may earn up to the 60 college credits required for their associate's degree or technical certificate. These credits may also be transferred to a four year college program. They have the option to begin work immediately in their chosen field, or continue with their education a year ahead of their peers toward a Bachelor's degree.

# Who is eligible to attend the Early College of Macomb?

Mature, highly motivated students who are ready for the challenges of college coursework leading to high demand careers are eligible if they meet the following criteria:

# **Application and Qualification**

- Are registered in one of the Macomb County public high schools housed within the participating districts
- Will be entering 11th grade in fall 2025
- Have met the criteria requirements
- Have submitted all application materials online
- Have been approved by their home high school

# **Admission Requirements**

Macomb Community College will use 2 sets of criteria to determine if students are qualified to participate:

- 1) Two English grades will be averaged:
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> semester of 9<sup>th</sup> grade and 1<sup>st</sup> term of 10<sup>th</sup> grade
  - The GPA for these two courses must be at least 2.0
- 2) Two Math grades will be averaged:
  - $\bullet$   $2^{\text{nd}}$  semester of  $9^{\text{th}}$  grade and  $1^{\text{st}}$  term of  $10^{\text{th}}$  grade
  - The GPA for these two courses must be at least 2.5

# **Acceptance**

**Space is limited.** Acceptance is based on student records, student GPA, attendance and recommendation by the home high school. Each participating high school allocates seats to the Early College of Macomb. ECM will notify parent/guardian of students' official acceptance into the program.
